### **School Annual Report 2019-20**

Respected dignitaries, parents, invitees, teaching and non-teaching fraternity of Sangameshwar Education society and my dear students!

Good evening to everyone gathered here.

This is Jahnvi kulkarni & this is Heeba Patel taking you through the wonderful journey of Sangameshwar Public School.

Sangameshwar Public School is the brain child of Shri. Dharmaraj Kadadi sir and it is hoped that there will be tremendous response for his conceptual school for small kids.

The school started functioning in the academic year 2015-16 with 115 students on roll. The no. shot up to 335 in the next year with the introduction of grades 1 to 8. This year the no. has risen to 813.

The inspection committee from CBSE visited school on 23<sup>rd</sup> Apl'2019 and we are now affiliated to CBSE, Delhi.

Let's have a look at some of the achievements that we have to our credit this year.

#### **Achievements- Academic**

The year 2019 has been very eventful for Sangameshwarians as some students registered remarkable achievements.

The school took part in Science Fest conducted in Hubli by The Hindu. 11 students from grade 7 to 10 took part in it. They presented altogether 5 projects. Lavanya Jadhav and Sania Bidri from grade 8 won consolation prize for Mini water heater project. The school also got catalyst award.

Three students from our school brought huge laurels to school when they were qualified in the finals in Spell Bee contest at national level. Arpita Chingunde got 45<sup>th</sup> rank, Swaranjali Chole 53<sup>rd</sup> and Poornima Gujale got 55<sup>th</sup> rank.

This year too some 80 students took part in Spell Bee and some 71 have qualified for the next level.

We train students in abacus also. Four students bagged prizes in various competitions

Our students took part in RANGOTSAV celebration , a national level drawing competition.

42 students were selected from our school for National level drawing competition for the year 2019-20.

Our students took part in Interschool competition held at MIT and won I and III prizes in 3 minutes solo, III prize in brand builders and II prize in mime act.

Our science teacher Ms. Arshi Maniyar was honoured with Nation Builder award on Teacher's Day.

### **Awards and recognition in sports**

Aiman Mujawar from grade 8 got 2<sup>nd</sup> place in Pune division Sikai Marshal Art Competition. She also became the winner in Kick Boxing and Sikai Marshal Art in Inter school competition by DSO Solapur and SMC

Affan Nadaf from grade 9 won 1<sup>st</sup> place in 50mtr Breast Stroke in swimming.

Prem Kore from grade 9 has secured 1<sup>st</sup> place in archery at city level.

Our yoga teacher Ms. Vaidehi Gore received Special trophy in yoga competition.

Gajanan Waghmare from grade 8 won at the city level competition in Taekwondo and is qualified for division matches.

Siddharaj Kulakrni won gold and silver medal and Parth Todkar won gold and bronze medal in karate competition held in Goa.

Dhanashri Dhaware from grade 2 became state level winner in Karate. She also became orange belt winner in Karate.

Yashraj Dhaware from grade 4 has won gold medal and orange belt in karate.

Ovi Takale , Megha Lande and Yashraj Tekale from grade 2 have won medals in marathon which was organized by CNS hospital.

### **News paper in Education**

To develop reading habits among us, and to improve our English language skills, the school has introduced The Hindu, student edition. We really have a lot of fun solving puzzles, attempting quiz, reading interesting articles and keeping us updated with day today happenings. I'm very thankful to school authorities for this.

## **Assembly**

Assembly is the biggest platform to showcase our talent. We learn self-expression, stage courage, presentation skill etc. by participating in assembly proceedings. We are growing into confident and assertive human beings and can face the global world. Ample opportunities are given to all the students to let out our creative outlets. Now-a-days, we are attempting paperless assembly.

## **Remedial Program**

In order to boost the confidence and increase the academic standard of the slow learners, remedial programme is arranged for the slow learners. I see a lot of my friends doing good in studies after attending these classes. Sometime we the students also help teachers to conduct remedial classes. This programme will be again continued during examination.

## **Mentoring and home visits**

We have at school mentoring programme under which each teacher gets about 10 to 12 students under his/ her care. The mentor works with mentees to give emotional, mental support and bring about positive changes in them. As part of it, the teachers visited the homes of mentees, had a talk with their parents to know more about the child.

## **Celebration of Important Days**

Celebration of important days is a part of school curriculum. They help students know about our rich culture and heritage. Yoga Day was celebrated on 21<sup>st</sup> June, guruvandana on Guru Poornima, Dindi on Ashadhi ekadasi, Janmashtami, navaratri were also celebrated with a lot of religious fervour. We celebrated 'Library Day' in memory of the father of library science Dr. S. R. Ranganathan.

## **Events/competitions / programmes**

The school has started 'bag less day' on Saturdays in order to free children from bags for at least a day in a week. A lot of activities are conducted from art, music, sports and computer depts. to keep children occupied in interesting and educative programmes.

Every year we hold exhibitions related to any subject. This year, we had Social –Science exhibition, 'A peep into the past'. Many exhibits related to history, geography and civics were displayed

The school held interschool competitions to commemorate the birth anniversary of Karmayogi Shri Appasaheb Kadadi, our founding father. There were 321 participants from 25 schools that took part in elocution, drawing and essay writing competition.

In order to develop leadership qualities in us and to empower us to take up challenges in life, our school takes up a lot of initiatives. A student council was formed this year also. The student leaders were nominated and elected by a committee. Hyder Ali was selected as Head boy and Jahnavi Kukarni as head girl. We were given badges and were invested with responsibilities in a

colourful function held on Independence day. We all felt so honoured to wear the badges. We are also discharging our duties as per the portfolios assigned to us.

## **Annapurna Movement**

I'm really thankful to school for nurturing in us the quality of showing empathy to the fellow beings, for grooming us as individuals capable of having compassion for those children who are not blessed like us. The school initiated a programme called 'Annapurna Movement' in which we collected donations from all students in the form of grains like wheat, jawar, rice, daal etc and gave it as charity to an orphanage called 'Apale Ghar' from Usamanabad dist. I'm very thankful to all the parents for their wholehearted support for this noble cause.

The school has tied up with Academy for creative teaching, B'lore for academic consultancy. The school success facilitator visits school once in a month for academic hand holding and training.

The teachers adopt the teaching techniques learnt in the training sessions. They have successfully adopted collaborative teaching techniques and are making students independent learners. The resource persons also conduct regular training sessions on modules related to current topics of education.

Our teachers attended some training sessions conducted by CBSE and by Academy for Creative teaching. Ms. Arati Mashal and Ms. Jyoti Mane attended a session on value education.
